The college was established on 11th of July 2012 by the Government of Chhattisgarh. The area of the college including the building, garden and field is 4.132 hectare. This college is located in a remote rural Revenue Circle/Development Block. The college provides sufficient amenities for learning-teaching exercise. The college building has been constructed as per norms and guidelines prescribed by the government for the purpose. The building contains 25 rooms and 5 laboratories. The building of the college is double storied with a stage and a big courtyard. All rooms are spacious and installed with lights and fans. All these rooms are situated and parts of the same building. Therefore, all academic, administrative and cultural activities happen in the same but a big building. There are three entrance gates on the ground floor, two staircases for the first floor and two staircases for the roof. The courtyard of the building is also used by students for games and sports and other activities. The college has a big meeting hall with ICT facilities installed in it. - 3. To facilitate continuous upgradation of knowledge & use of technology, by faculty and students.
- 4. To fulfil its social obligations, in the manner of providing formal & informal education, dissemination of knowledge, organizing programmes and activities for the benefit of the community and other stakeholders.
- 5. To create awareness and initiate measures for Protecting and

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promoting the Environment.
